Global Graphics announces divestiture of Harlequin Dylan

Global Graphics (Easdaq, GLGR) announced today that all development, marketing, sales and support of its Harlequin Dylan programming environment will be transferred free of charge to functional Objects Inc., a new company being founded by key members of the Dylan development team. The divestiture of the Dylan activity, which is part of Harlequin's Software Tools division, will be effective September 30, 1999 and will result in cost savings of 750,000 euros annually.

"While it does not fit into the current Harlequin product profile and business model, we are pleased that a satisfactory solution was found which ensures continuity of the product", said James Freidah, COO of Harlequin Ltd.

Harlequin Dylan is a sophisticated Integrated Development Environment for Windows 95/98/NT. The Dylan language was originally designed by Apple Computer in conjunction with researchers from primarily Harlequin and Carnegie Mellon University.
